Under the direction and supervision of the ALC Education Director, this position is responsible for teaching primarily English Language Arts/humanities courses. This role includes scheduled in-class courses as well as managing web-based and independent study course options.

Skills and Qualifications:

- Must hold a valid Manitoba K-12 teaching certification (Bachelor of Education Degree).
- A recent Criminal Records / Vulnerable Sector Search and Child Abuse Registry check is required.
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively in a flexible, non-traditional program with adult learners is essential.
- Ability to establish work priorities and ensure deadlines are met and procedures are followed is essential.
- Excellent interpersonal, communication, organizational and writing skills are essential.
- An understanding of adult learning principles and teaching practices is preferred.
- Experience with adult learners in literacy, adult basic education, work related training or post-secondary programs is preferred.
- Familiarity with Manitoba Education's web-based course system is preferred.
- Familiarity with issues specifically concerning Aboriginal youth and adults, as well as an understanding of the inner city environment is preferred.
